



Ronnie James is well known throughout the Irish community. A member of the Point Saint Charles diaspora, he attended Riverside Elementary and Lorne School before moving on to Montreal High School. Ronnie was a proud member of Leo's Boys, speaking glowingly about his experiences whenever he has the opportunity.

Ronnie is perhaps best known as the longtime Equipment Manager of the Montreal Alouettes. His association with the Alouettes began in 1996 upon the team's return when he served as Assistant Equipment Manager. In 1998 Ronnie was promoted to Equipment Manager, a position he held through the 2016 season. After twenty years in the equipment room, Ronnie is now the team's Travel & Logistics Coordinator. During his time with the Alouettes, Ronnie has played a part in nine Grey Cup games. He now owns 3 championship rings, which he earned in 2002, 2009, and 2010.

What is less known about Ronnie is his benevolent activities. He has donated an endless amount of raffle prizes, auction items, and a significant amount of time to the Point Wish Softball Tournament, the Point Saint Charles Hall of Recognition, and numerous other community initiatives.

Lifelong friends, Cindy and Gerry were married in St. Gabriel's Church in 1985. Together, they have three children: Todd, Victoria, and Ashley.

Cindy and Gerry have long been church volunteers.

She volunteered her cooking skills for the resident priests and seminarians, and together, along with Terry Clahane and Darleen Marchand, they catered various church events. They ran the Parish's bingo evenings, flea markets, helped with the children's liturgy, and numerous other activities. They continue to help with the Parish's Christmas basket program, Lenten lunches, and two annual fundraising

Alan Jones 2018 Liam Daly Heritage Award Recipient



Born in Wales, Alan Jones became interested in Irish traditional music in the late 1960s, after first hearing it played in local folk music clubs and then hearing the great travelling Irish Uilleann piper Finbar Furey on BBC radio. Following numerous years of persistent searching, he eventually obtained his own set of Irish pipes and has since spent his life learning about the instrument and its practitioners. Alan has been a longtime member of Na Piobairi Uilleann (the Irish Pipers' Association) and has travelled extensively in pursuit of his passion for Irish traditional music and culture.

Alan, an engineer by profession, emigrated to Canada in 1979, and it was not very long afterward that he was being interviewed and performing on Liam Daly's Montreal Irish TV show. While pursuing a Bachelor of Fine Arts Degree at Concordia University he undertook numerous Irish Studies courses, further expanding his knowledge of Irish history, geography, culture and music.

As an avid supporter of things Irish, Alan frequently performs at various events, in concerts and at festivals etc., playing and promoting the Irish pipes and Irish traditional music. He has marched in St. Patrick's parades

playing bagpipes, has piped for the Irish community's annual march to the Irish Memorial site at the Victoria Bridge in Montreal, has performed at the Grosse Ile Memorial site 150th anniversary for Parks Canada, played his Uilleann pipes for Cine Gael's 1916 Uprising 100th anniversary vintage silent movie showing, and performed the theme music for the acclaimed film Love and Savagery, which was filmed in Ireland and Newfoundland, and directed by John Smith, produced by Kevin Tierney, and featured Alan Hawco as one of the principal actors. He has performed on behalf of Concordia University in promoting the Irish Studies department with mayors and ministers at the municipal, provincial and federal levels. In 2004, Alan was the invited Uilleann piper who performed with renowned Irish flute player and ethnomusicologist Desi Wilkinson, in a special concert called "Ireland on the St. Lawrence" which traced the strong musical roots between Irish and Quebec (French Canadian) traditional music.

For his commitment to Irish traditional music and Irish culture, the United Irish Societies of Montreal is pleased to present the 2018 Liam Daly Heritage Award to Alan Jones.

The United Irish Societies of Montreal at Ninety

Ninety years ago the United Irish Societies of Montreal was founded for the purposes of organizing the annual St. Patrick's Parade, taking over as its custodians.

Since that time the organization has seen thirty five individuals serve as President from various walks of life. John I. McCaffrey, founding president who served during the 1929 and 1930 seasons, was known as the organist at St. Ann's Church. Mabel Fitzgerald became the first woman to serve as its president, serving during the 1992 and 1993 seasons. The longest serving president in the organization's history was John Loye, who served from 1934 to 1957. Loye was a historian, writer, draftsman, and commercial artist.

In its history the organization has honoured eighty nine men

and women by naming them Parade Grand Marshal. The only man to be so honoured twice in this time is Dr. L.P. Nelligan, who was honoured in 1939 and 1959. Many politicians have led the Parade along its route, from local city councillors, to provincial representatives, to members of parliament. In 1980 future prime minister Brian Mulroney was honoured as Grand Marshal. It wasn't until Margaret Healy served as Grand Marshal in 2005 that the organization saw its first female. The first former president to be named Grand Marshal was George O'Reilly, who assumed the position for the Olympic year Parade in 1976. Seven

subsequent former presidents went on to be honoured as Grand Marshal and, in 2012, current president Paul Loftus led the Parade along Saint Catherine Street.

The Chief Reviewing Officer was introduced to the Parade in 1952. Originally an honour reserved for those Irish by birth or descent, the first non Irish person to be honoured was fittingly the 1967 Chief Reviewing Officer, Montreal Mayor Jean Drapeau. Since then, community leaders from various backgrounds have taken the salutes at the Reviewing Stand. Mabel Fitzgerald continued to be the trailblazer in the organization when in 2002 she was honoured as the first female Chief Reviewing Officer.

In 1956 the Queen's Pageant was introduced. The Pageant was held at the Montreal Sailors' Club in Old Montreal. Different Parishes had promoted young ladies as Queen

of their units in prior years. Today the Queen's Selection Evening is a public speaking event open to single women from eighteen to twenty five years of age who are either Irish or of Irish descent who live in the Montreal area.

While undoubtedly the people who have been honoured in various ways were humbled by the community recognition, it is the quiet work in the community that the organization is most pleased with. From the mid 1960s through 2014 the Entertainment Committee travelled to mens' hostels, seniors residences, and other places where people could not necessarily get out during the cold Winter months, entertaining men and women and spreading their joy and happiness through song and dance.



The jewel in the organization's crown has to be the annual Christmas Draw. Since 1967 the organization has promoted a Draw. The \$154 proceeds from the inaugural year were donated to the Montreal Children's Hospital for the purchase of a special wheelchair. Tickets were sold for a modest sum of 5 for \$1.00 or \$.25 per ticket. In 1979 prizes of alcohol were eliminated, replaced by cash prizes. In 1981, the price of tickets increased to \$1.00, which remains in effect today. In 1992, total prizes increased to \$2,000, also in effect today. The purpose of this project is to have a self financed. membership driven, event that helps less fortunate

members of the community at a time of the year when they are at their most vulnerable. The members are encouraged to sell a total of eight thousand tickets and they may submit names of families in need to the committee chairperson. The proceeds of the Christmas Draw benefit approximately sixty needy families, mainly in the Southwest, Verdun, and LaSalle boroughs of the City of Montreal.

As in 1928, the organization continues to bring the community together. It continues to work hand in hand with its sister organizations toward the common good, whatever the goal may be. May the United Irish Societies of Montreal live on for another 90 years and may it bring joy and happiness to many more generations of Montrealers of all backgrounds.

Go ahead, be 'Irish for a day,' says St. Patrick's Day Parade Grand Marshal

Elizabeth Quinn loves everything about Montreal's annual St. Patrick's Day Parade, but what she loves best is that festive feeling, that sense that everyone is "Irish for a day".

"If you walk along the parade route, it's like the League of Nations on both sides," Quinn told the Montreal Gazette. "All ethnic groups are there and they all wear green and they have their thumbs up, saying they are Irish for a day. We all have a good time and that's what it's all about."

Quinn is the Grand Marshal of Montreal's 195th St. Patrick's Day Parade, which begins Sunday at noon on the corner of City Councillors St. and de Maisonneuve Blvd. The route — altered this year to accommodate roadwork underway along Ste-Catherine St. — will follow de Maisonneuve Blvd. westward to Mackay St. and then south to René-Lévesque Blvd.

For the past 30 years, Quinn has been actively involved with the United Irish Societies, which has organized Montreal's parade for the past 90 years. A committed community volunteer, Quinn first joined to participate as a singer in a UIS-sponsored group that entertains seniors in retirement homes. She loves to sing, particularly old Irish favourites.

A retired school teacher, Quinn became more and more involved, eventually being elected president of the organization in 2000 and 2001. She continues to sit on a number of its organizing committees. Still, Quinn said she was shocked to learn she had been nominated last October as grand marshal of the parade.

She is only the second woman to serve, following Margaret Healy back in 2005. But Quinn says she was surprised to be nominated, not because she is female, but because she is such an active member of the UIS.

"Normally we don't really give our own that honour.... So when I was nominated, I was very shocked of course and dismayed. I kept saying, 'Oh no, no, no. You have to pick someone else. This is crazy.' But they said, 'No you've been around a long time and you do a lot so we would like to honour you.' So what could I say?

"Anyway, it's a great honour for me because I've been a part of who they are for many, many years and there is nothing better than getting an award from your peers."

Still, Quinn finds herself squinting a little uncomfortably in the limelight.

"I'm used to being in the background. I'm a backstage worker and I like it that way. But it is grand. The only thing is there are so many things to go to, you can't imagine."

Of course the busiest day of Quinn's mandate will be this Sunday. She'll be meeting with other parade organizers and dignitaries for breakfast at a downtown hotel, then heading off to the annual "Green Mass" at St. Patrick's Basilica (454 René-Lévesque Blvd. W.) at 10 a.m. where the Archbishop of Montreal Reverend Christian Lépine will preside.

Then it's off to the parade, where she hopes to wave to as many as 500,000 "Irish" Montrealers and tourists.

The parade this year will consist of about 20 floats, 25 marching bands and about 4,000 individuals.

Participants will include Montreal Mayor Valérie Plante, local police and firefighters and various media personalities as well as members of the Black Watch Royal Highland R egiment of Canada Pipes and Drums, the Kahnawake Peacekeepers, Royal Canadian Mounted Police Band, Girl Guides and Boy Scouts organizations, and representatives from many of the city's Irish pubs plus many more.

"The Irish love to celebrate. We love to dance and sing and party," Quinn said. "It's about sharing our culture and welcoming people to join us."
